- B. Julie West brought Practice Sheet/Records handouts too! © and goes over the process. Julie also presents Listening Logs © that are divided into 8 components of music and guides them through the process and develops listening skills.
- C. "Mary's Circle of Fifths" Hand out ©, which teaches learning the tune in multiple keys, key signatures, sharps & flats & transposition. Chords of Just Intonation Handout © that serves as a reference tool for chords and their cent variations in Just intonation. Lastly, a handout © that covers the notes that tend to be out of tune on each of the instruments & a Chorale that students can play and helps them aurally identify out of tune notes (application) and it gives them the opportunity to have students listen and adjust accordingly to practice compensating for the instrument's tendency. Mark offers to send any teacher a set of these for each instrument and even an envelop for teachers to fill out on the spot! And he will send them out ASAP!
